General elections are the key event where citizens vote for their preferred candidates. The outcome determines who will hold public office.

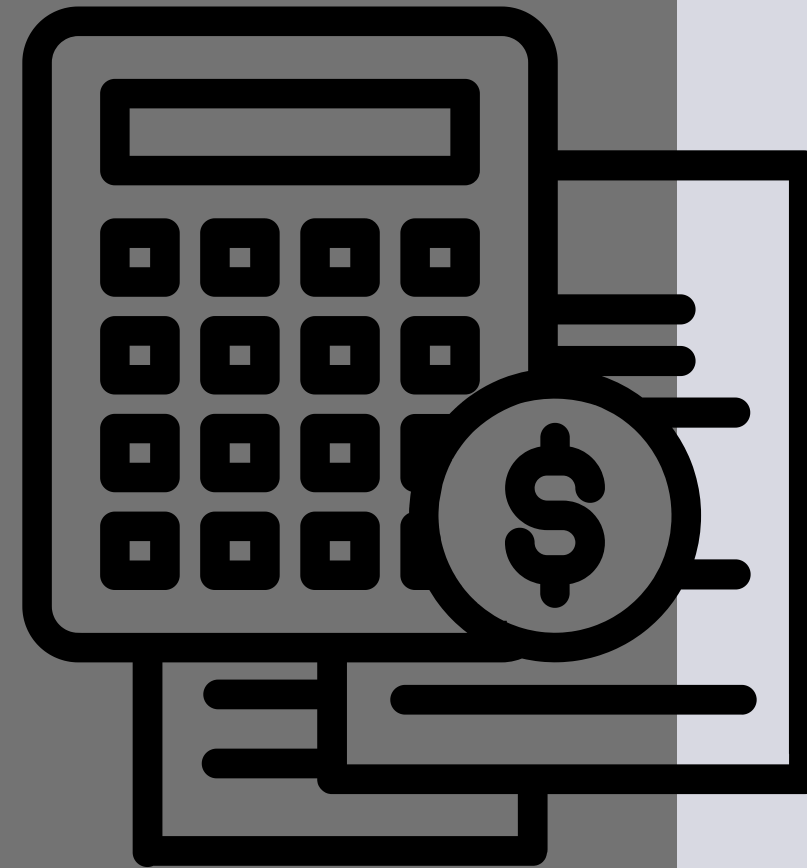
The Role of Political Parties
